### Intent

At Royles Brook Primary School, it is our intent during art and design:

- To engage, inspire and challenge children.
- To teach the skills needed for the seven elements of art.
- To expose children to a variety of artists.
- To give children the opportunity to explore different art mediums.
- To allow children to explore, experiment and practise before creating a final piece.
- To allow children to evaluate their final piece and the journey they have been on in order to create it.



In the EYFS children are allowed opportunities to explore a range of media and materials. They are taught skills and techniques through adult focused activities and can then practise these techniques independently.

Children will be able to evaluate their work.

During Key Stage One, children are given the opportunity to develop their art skills through the seven elements of art and in Key Stage Two, they are given the opportunity to do this with greater control.

Vocabulary is displayed within the learning environment at an age-appropriate level. Children receive opportunities to develop a range of art techniques using the seven elements of art in Key Stage One and receive the opportunity to further refine these skills in Key Stage Two.

Children will be able to create individual pieces of art.
